



## Saint Paul Festival & Heritage Foundation Golf Tournament Covid-19 Procedures August 17, 2020

Your safety during our golf tournament is our first priority, and we are implementing many precautions to maintain an enjoyable and safe environment during our event. Some things you can expect:

### Prior to the Golf Tournament:

- Attendees will be asked to monitor their temperature and symptoms prior to the event
- If you are feeling ill, we ask you not to attend the tournament.

### Registration:

- When you arrive at the golf course:
  - Masks are **required** at all times, except when riding on the cart and playing golf with your foursome.
  - Attendees will be asked to complete a wellness health screening, listing if they are experiencing any symptoms of the virus at the event & your temperature will be taken.
- Once you have completed your health screening, please check in at the registration table.
  - Please keep a 6ft social distance between yourselves and others during registration.
  - There will be different activities & competition that you can purchase into during the tournament, we will accept cash, checks and cards for these.
  - Check-in for your cart assignment and bring your bags to your own cart.

### Carts:

- Carts are equipped with plexiglass between the driver and the passenger seat on all carts.
  - If you would like to have your own cart and have not already requested it, please reach out by Wednesday, August 12<sup>th</sup>
- Hand Sanitizer will be available for the golfers courtesy of **Mischke Financial Group LLC**
- Your Tournament "goodie bag" will also be placed on your cart for minimal contact.

### Lunch:

- Box lunches will be provided for our guests.
- We ask that you find a location on the patio or near your cart to enjoy your lunch before teeing off.
- You are welcome to take the lunch with you on the course, if you prefer.
- If you have not submitted any dietary restrictions, please do so by Wednesday, August 12<sup>th</sup>

### Golf Course:

- Please allow for social distancing while you are playing on the course with your foursome.
- Ball washers will not be available on the course
- Please leave the pins in the cup and do not touch them while on the green.
- Games on the golf course will be monitored by a volunteer, and they will enter your name on the cards for longest putt, etc to avoid multiple touches.

### **Dinner & Awards:**

- Masks will be required when you are not sitting at your table for dinner.
- Our venue is large enough to adhere to a 25% room capacity for everyone to maintain proper distance, and tables will be placed at least 6 feet apart.
- Only 4 people will be allowed per table.
- A plated dinner will be served to the guests during the presentation.
- If you have not provided your dietary restrictions, please do so by Wednesday, August 12<sup>th</sup>

### **Golf Tournament Rules:**

#### **FORMAT: Four-person scramble – any combination of men/women.**

- Each player hits from Tee Box
- Team chooses best shot of the four, all players shoot from within a club length of the best ball
- Once at the Green, everyone putts from the exact location of the best putt
- The Highest score on each hole will be a **Bogey**. Once you have hit a bogey score, please pick up your ball and move to the next hole.

#### **RULES:**

- No one person's shot will be used more than three times in a row. Each golfer must contribute two drives and two putts for the eighteen-hole event. Each foursome will have recorded one score per hole.
- Men tee off on the White tees and women on the Red tees.
- No mulligans or "gimmies" are allowed.
- First try is your only chance to win hole-in-one prizes.
- All players must hit from within one club length of the chosen shot. The one club length CANNOT be used to make the shot easier. For example: if the chosen shot has a tree obstructing your shot, then all must hit with the tree obstruction – NO moving the ball to the side of the tree by one club length.
- On the green, use a marker to mark the chosen shot and then each person putts from the exact location.
- If your team only has three players, then golfers take turns driving two shots. For example, player one will hit two shots, player two hits second shot and so on.
- If a tie occurs in the final score, the team with the best score on the hole with the highest handicap wins.
- One prize per person on the hole games.
- USGA rules govern all play – White Stakes – OUT OF BOUNDS, Yellow stakes – DIRECT HAZARD, Red stakes – LATERAL HAZARD
- Please repair divots and ball marks.
